Missing Girl Case Deepens After Surveillance Image and False Alarm

Concern continues to grow over the disappearance of a young girl who went missing several days ago after entering a wooded area to collect berries and herbs. When she failed to return, search efforts were initiated and remain ongoing.

Public attention intensified after a brief online message began circulating stating, "I found my wife in the woods." While the claim could not be verified, it coincided with the emergence of a surveillance image showing what appeared to be a frightened young girl seated on the passenger seat of a motorcycle at night near an industrial area. The rider could not be identified, but the image prompted investigators to expand their inquiries.

Further alarm followed when the operator of a waste disposal site reported a suspicious object discovered inside a garbage container. Police were immediately notified, and crime scene investigators secured the area to preserve potential evidence.

The scene was later cleared after authorities confirmed the object was a discarded shop mannequin and not connected to the missing girl. Officials stated the response followed standard procedures given the circumstances.

Authorities continue to review surveillance material and witness reports related to the motorcycle sighting. The whereabouts of the missing girl remain unknown, and all credible leads remain under active review.

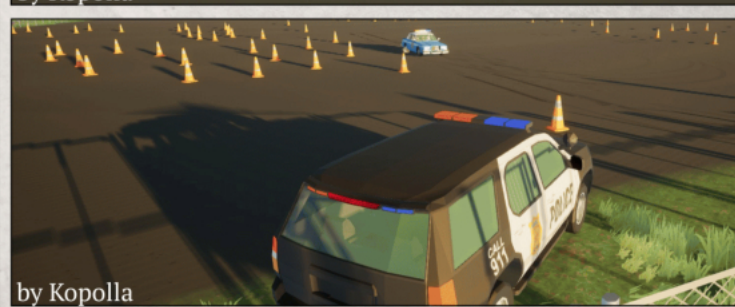
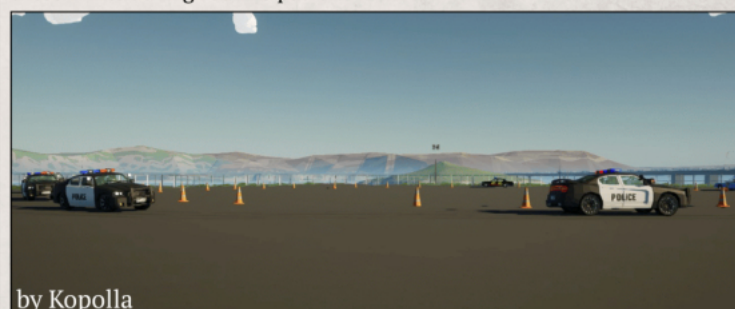


Police Officers Complete Advanced Driver Safety Training

A comprehensive driver safety training exercise was recently conducted for police officers, focusing on vehicle control, situational awareness, and coordinated response under demanding conditions.

The program combined theoretical instruction with practical driving exercises in a controlled environment. Officers trained emergency braking, evasive maneuvers, precision handling, and coordinated driving techniques designed for high-risk and low-visibility situations. Several patrol vehicles were reportedly pushed well beyond their usual comfort zones, though all returned in one piece.

According to officials, the training is intended to enhance operational readiness and ensure that officers are better prepared to respond safely and effectively to incidents across the region—preferably without testing these limits during routine patrols.



Nighttime Stunt Activities Under Investigation

Authorities have confirmed that multiple reports of dangerous nighttime stunt activities are currently under investigation across the region. According to police sources, unidentified individuals have been observed constructing improvised ramps and trailer-based structures near roads and industrial areas after dark. These setups are allegedly used for vehicle stunts and unauthorized access to elevated locations. Officials warn that such activities pose a serious risk to public safety, particularly when structures are left behind or placed near active roadways. Several locations have been secured and cleared as a precaution. Law enforcement has increased patrols during nighttime hours and urges the public to report suspicious construction or activity immediately.

B.A.S.E. 41 Expands Fleet with Two New Recovery Vehicles

B.A.S.E. 41 has expanded its operational capabilities with the delivery of two new recovery vehicles. The units, designated Longhorn Rollback UL, are equipped with underlift (UL) systems designed for complex and heavy-duty recovery operations. The vehicles arrived by sea at Jeju Harbor and were transferred to the B.A.S.E. 41 headquarters as part of a carefully organized convoy.

The coordinated transfer highlighted the scale and operational significance of the delivery.

According to the company, the new Longhorn Rollback UL vehicles will improve response flexibility and reduce recovery times, further strengthening B.A.S.E. 41's readiness across the region.

Highway Closed for Hours After Garbage Truck Catches fire

A major highway was closed for several hours after garbage inside a waste collection vehicle ignited during a towing operation.
